Bishop Eaton came just a few days after Fr. Frisby's last Sunday with us back in late May. The Bishop encouraged the Vestry to look forward with anticipation and to be transparent to the membership. Weekly updates were accomplished and sent by e-mail. Paper copies have been available from the ushers. Of course, if anyone wants copies they may have missed I can provide them.

**Why are the weekly updates positive and upbeat?** Because Success breeds Success. Unlike the first disciples, we are not sitting around wondering what is next in a cloistered room. With Vestry and lay leadership fully engaged, All Saints is moving onward. WE are the church. WE, the church, are doing things we know need to be done and that WE can do to make our parish more welcoming to newcomers and more attractive to a new priest looking for a congregation to serve.

**Is everything going well?** Of course not.

Are some people sad, angry or otherwise disgruntled? Yes, that always happens among people at the time of transition. Every effort has been made to reach out to those who have expressed their concerns and displeasure. Many have been called to help mitigate these issues.

Are all things going along as fast as might be hoped? No. This parish's accomplishments are based on members who are retired and others who are working for a living. Many are having life events which have delayed some of the work needed.

The Vestry accepts the gift of time and talent as provided.

The recently completed, conservative five-year budget does not include enough money for a priest with the same experience as our previous 3 rectors, **AND** an office manager without the efforts of fund raising and increased pledges.

Successful operation of the Thrift Shop is critical as it is a cash cow that continues to provide funds to support our physical plant and operations. Encourage friends, neighbors and family to donate. Consider volunteering as this ministry needs more than 6 people to operate comfortably without burdening a few, when we all benefit.

Welcoming and retaining the newcomers to be part of our ministry on the Treasure Coast is critical. Each of us is part of that effort as ambassadors for Christ.

## **DEACON'S REPORT**

As many of you know, my primary ministry has been Kairos Prison Ministry. I started doing this ministry in 2012 at Okeechobee State Prison in June. Just prior to this, I participated in an Episcopal Cursillo Weekend, because Kairos Ministry is based on Cursillo and it has been felt very strongly that to be an effective Kairos volunteer, you should first experience Cursillo and be an active Cursillo member.

I have now done 13 Kairos weekends, three at Okeechobee Prison and 10 at Martin Correctional Institution. I am not participating in the upcoming weekend in October, as the Kairos Program wants us to take a break and let others participate to get new volunteers involved.

I still, however am involved in Kairos in several other ways, such as serving on the Advisory Council and attending reunion weekends at Martin which occur every third Saturday of the month and are attended by over 100 residents, most of whom have already been on a Kairos weekend. Just like Cursillo, you can only do one weekend as a candidate. After this as a committed person to Jesus Christ, you are expected to be in a prayer and share group as well as reaching out to others to share with them your love of Christ.

Kairos is an active ministry in over thirty prisons in Florida, in almost every state and in many countries throughout the world. It is definitely an international ministry to share the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to impact the hearts and lives of incarcerated men, women and youth as well as their families. Our goal is to help these incarcerated persons to become productive citizens of their communities.

Although I won't be directly involved in the upcoming Kairos Weekend from Thursday, October 18 - Sunday October 21, I want to solicit your support of this weekend with posters, prayers and financial support. It costs almost \$2000 to purchase all we need to do the weekend.

Thank you all for your past support as I know you all believe in this very spiritual program and its effectiveness in helping the incarcerated persons in our society who often feel so rejected.

**Gift Baskets:** Always a favorite....any gift theme

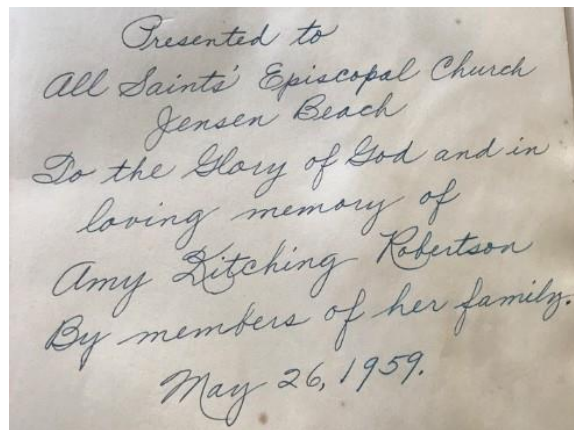
**Pet Gifts:** to assemble in gift baskets for our furry friends

**Electronics:** Unless brand new in box and new or current technology, these items are not popular, and do not usually justify the space.

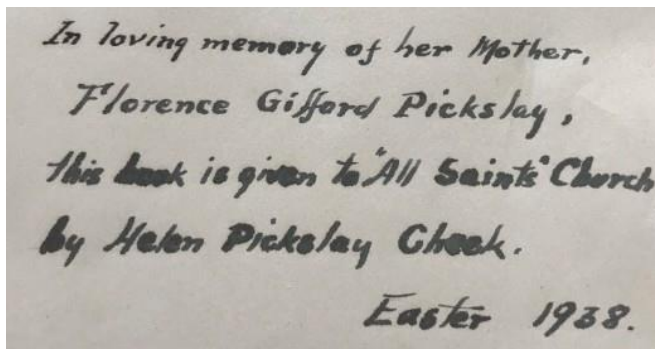

# Welcome to Stewardship 2019!

Looking forward to 2019, as the Senior Warden for All Saints' Episcopal Church, I want to give everyone an insight into how we will be handling this year's Stewardship effort.

First of all, the Vestry started working on this in June – not October, and Vestry member Paul Neff is serving as our Chair.

In October, Paul Neff, Stewardship Chair and Bill Winsemann, Treasurer will be speaking at the Men's and Women's Fellowship meetings to provide detailed presentations on our needs for funds to support our incoming clergy.

The first week of November, you will receive our solicitation letter, along with your pledge card. There will be budget presentations after both services on Sunday November 4<sup>th</sup> to further inform the congregation.

**Sunday November 18th will be Pledge Sunday. Bring your pledge card.**

We are asking people to bring in their completed pledge card on, or before November 18<sup>th</sup>, in order that the Treasurer will be able to fill in the Pledge income projections for 2019 in the draft

## **Annual Budget.**

After Thanksgiving, on the first two Sundays of December at each service, the congregation will be given feedback on how well the Stewardship 2019 effort has been.

In closing, as you may be aware, many members of this parish provide funding for items for which the parish has benefitted, but are not part of the **Parish's Annual Budget**.

So, if we decide we want a full-time Priest, a paid Office Manager, a Music Director, or for example a Cleaning Service, whatever it is that we want:

**We have to support with our Pledges our 2019 Annual Operating Budget.**

## **Giving to All Saints - and the Tax Act**

At a recent financial review meeting of All Saints officers, vestry, and organization representatives, our UBS advisor highlighted two ways to make a lifetime gift to All Saints even if you are unable to deduct the gift as an itemized deduction because of restrictions of the 2017 Tax Act (only one in twenty taxpayers will now be able to itemize deductions). Although most often giving to All Saints is not motivated by whether or not there is a tax deduction, there are distinct tax advantages for two ways of lifetime giving:

**Do you wish to benefit All Saints during your lifetime?** If you are over the age of 70 ½, you must take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your IRA and pay taxes on that distribution. But if you take a portion of that distribution as a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) to All Saints or the All Saints' Endowment, the gift reduces your RMD and so lowers your taxable income. The gift may also reduce the amount of your social security benefits that will be taxed. The gift must be made directly to All Saints or the All Saints' Endowment

**Do you own appreciated stock?** All Saints now has an account that is able to accept stock that has appreciated in value. If you've owned securities for more than a year and you gift the shares to All Saints, neither you nor All Saints will owe any capital gains tax. If you don't give away the stock, sooner or later you'll sell it, and your profits on the sale will be taxed. This is better than selling your stock, paying the taxes, and donating the cash.

Remember, you may gift to All Saints' Church with or without a specific purpose, but if you wish your gift to go to the Endowment (our fund "in perpetuity" for the benefit of All Saints), you must specify the "All Saints' Endowment" or the "Heritage Society".

1898 All Saints' Episcopal Church Listed on the Martin County Historic Register  
*(by Julie Preast on 9/2/18 for All Saints' Newsletter)*

Research by Julie Preast took about one year to compile on the 120 year history of All Saints' Episcopal Church with the assistance of Joyce Fletcher Menard, Church Historian, and Parish Architect, Paul Neff, who re-created the drawings for the structural additions that took place in 1963, 1979 and 1994. In the 1800's almost every structure constructed was reported in the newspaper. Mr. J. Bell of Bell & Baker Contractors built the "little church on the hill;" however, there was no mention of an architect in newspaper articles. In 1852 distinguished architect and cabinet maker, Richard Upjohn, published a pattern book for churches made of wood that inspired small congregations and pioneers. Therefore, All Saints' was probably designed using drawings and details from a pattern book enhanced with the articulated wood creations by local pioneer carpenters.

All Saints' is in perfect cruciform proportion. Our Church evokes spirituality through its artistic carpentry and stained glass windows. The attention to detail with impressive skilled joinery, quality local wood and finishing are remarkable for that time and place. There is evidence that hand-made nails were used. The original bell was donated by prominent settlers, Captain and Mrs. Sewall. The additions made to the rear of the church deliberately complement the materials and craftsmanship of the historic construction.

The Carpenter Gothic style All Saints' Episcopal Church was officially designated on May 12, 2018 as a place of historic significance within Martin County. In the future, Joyce, Paul and Julie will polish the Martin County Historic Preservation Board Petition document and nominate All Saints' Episcopal Church for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. In 2019 Joyce and Julie hope to nominate All Saints' Cemetery for listing on the Martin County Historic Register.

**Note:** For a time, we have changed the type of candle we are using as our Thrift Shop accumulates lots of votive candles. At first, I was afraid to use them as I was not sure how long they would burn. After testing, I found they last 6 hours in most cases. So, in order to use what is at hand, these “free” votive candles will be used up in order to conserve funds. Added bonus, they will not break the glass when they burn out!

Candles have long been a tradition in churches throughout the world. What a comfort it is to know that somewhere a small flame is burning in honor of a loved one.

In the lighting of candles, we remember and truly live the words of Our Lord: "I am the Light of the World." In the lighting of candles we not only pray, but our prayers become smaller symbols of the One Light of Christ. Lighting a candle is a way of extending one's prayer and showing solidarity with the person on whose behalf the prayer is offered.

Even though the candles are small, they will burn for 6 hours and not break the glass. Please do not be afraid to light a candle. They represent prayers said and look beautiful!
